30px (22.5pt) - Capitalised Gotham Narrow - Book Paragraph 16px (12pt)

22px (16.5pt) Kerning: .5px (0.375pt) Gotham Narrow - Medium

Too small?

It's important that all text is clearly readable. If the sizes on the left are too small, it is recommended to increase the size of all proportionately.

Which one?

For web-based and online services use the SLQ logotype (wordmark) as the primary logo at the head of the content.

Avoid using any of the other SLQ logovariations where possible.

The SLQ speech bubble with State Library of Queensland text can be used in the content footer.

Colour Palette

Usage

Start with primary background and text colours unless making containers to isolate other content or UI components such as menus, buttons, formfields etc.

See Colour contrast to determine which background and text colours work well together.

Colour contrast

To adhere to the Queensland Government's supported guidelines for accessibility it is important that the colours we use, especially for text has a contrast ratio of at least 4.5:1 except for large text which should be more than 3:1. Refer to WCAG 2.0 guidelines for more information.

To the left you will be able to see what colours work well together and which ones should not be used together.

GENERAL TIPS AND SUGGESTIONS

- UI element corners should be sharp (no rounding)
- Borders/strokes should only be used between components with the same background colour
- It is important to stick with design choices throughout the design
- Use as few style variations as possible, a simple aesthetic is easier on the eye
- Although not currently covered in this document please make sure to use consistent padding and margins around all elements of the design. More space inbetween elements makes it less cluttered and its easier to digest the content.
- Colour contrast is important and WCAG 2.0 is compliant with government requirements
- Use of additional/different colours needs to be discussed with the Communications & Marketing team
- Try to align UI elements, text and images with each other
- Try not to stay inside of any recommended widths or heights (and add some padding)
- There are always exceptions to the rules, just make sure it looks consistent!

HERO AND HEADER IMAGES

Eventbrite main event image

Eventbrite provides built-in cropping tool and will scale up images if needed.



SLQ Wiki hero image

Image width will be automatically cropped (left to right) when resizing browser window. 628 is maximum width with browser maximised @ 1920x1080 resultion.



SLQ Website header image (blog post)

A hero or header image needs to be added manually to appear on the page. The image will be scaled to **700px wide and the height is variable** (recommeded to keep under 475px).

SLQ Website thumbnail

Requires image larger than 400x400px but will display the image as 3:2 (348x232px).



SLQ Website hero (event)

The image har a miximum size of **1890x400px** and will rescale with browser window and mobile devices.


